Address your strengths and weaknesses to ace the LSAT. Since every question counts for the LSAT, each one is crucial. If you find that logic games come fairly easily to you, but that logical reasoning is your weakness, spend time to 1) ensure you can answer every games question correctly on every practice test and 2) develop your logical reasoning skills by learning and practicing the question types. Additionally, according to the LSAC's extensive research, LSAT scores are strong predictors of success during the first year of law school. As we've written here, LSAT scores are predictive for law school success because the LSAT tests the same skills students will need in law school and in their law careers. Not only does taking a longer time to prep increase the chances of a higher LSAT score, but it also increases the chance of a higher GPA in law school. Combining these two main methods of studying (paying for a course and self-study) should get anyone on track to ace the LSAT while on a budget. The cost of studying generally should range between \$200 and \$1700 – combining any of the options outlined above can easily get you within that range.
