Timothy Murphy (1751–1818) was a rifleman in the American Revolutionary War. At the Battle of Bemis Heights (Second Battle of Saratoga) on October 7, 1777, Murphy is reputed to have shot and killed Sir Francis Clerke and General Simon Fraser. Murphy's life is the subject of John Brick's 1953 novel, *The Rifleman*. No retelling the story of Revolutionary War soldiers is complete without the insertion in the foreground the French and Germans clad in their distinctive uniforms.
